

Annual Modern Slavery Statement 2019

This statement relates to Craneware PLC, covering all business regions and subsidiaries. The statement relates to the financial year ending 30 June 2019.

1. Introduction

At Craneware, we are committed to conducting our dealings, whether with customers, suppliers, employees or the communities in which they are based, with the utmost integrity and as such we are committed to supporting the elimination of acts of modern slavery. In all our dealings, we are required to respect people and to value their diversity to support better outcomes for all.

2. Adherence to our Ethos

We recognise our responsibility for upholding and protecting the human rights of our employees and other individuals with whom we deal in our operations across the world. We have zero tolerance to slavery and human trafficking.

Our Anti-Slavery and Human Trafficking Policy reflects our commitment to act ethically and with integrity in all our business relationships and to implement and enforce effective systems and controls to ensure slavery and human trafficking is not taking place anywhere in our supply chains. To ensure that those we work with comply with our ethos, we require those in our supply chains to adhere to the Policy and incorporate it into their own business practices. If a company in our supply chain fails to comply with the Policy, we may terminate our contract and cease to do business with them.

3. Identifying, Assessing and Managing Risk

We believe that our exposure to the risks of modern slavery is low within our own business and supply chain. However, this assessment is kept under continuous review to confirm if circumstance change requiring the introduction of additional actions. Potential suppliers must demonstrate their capability to meet our contractual requirements. We also look for a clear demonstration of commitment to corporate social responsibility.

We also require employees to comply with the Policy and encourage them to report any concerns they may have in relation to anti-slavery and human trafficking. Any violation of the Policy may result in disciplinary action, including dismissal.

We have a clear Whistleblowing Policy in place, which is published on our company intranet, which allows our employee to easily report any anti-slavery and human trafficking concerns in confidence without fear of disciplinary action.

4. Effective Action to Address Modern Slavery

No instances of modern slavery have been identified during the year.



5. Training and Awareness

To ensure a high level of understanding of the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking in our supply chains and our business, we provide training to our employees as part of our annual Legal and Regulatory Curriculum.

This statement has been approved by the Craneware Risk and Compliance Committee and is made in accordance with Section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015.
